

Calculus 1B: Examination Rules

The following rules apply:

In the seventh week there is a cumulative exam.

- This exam covers all material of Calculus1B and lasts two hours, students with a disability are allowed to take a little longer.
- Notes and electronic devices are not allowed.

The maximum number of points to be gained is 36, the actual score is denoted by p .

In the tenth week there is again a cumulative exam (resit).

For this exam the same rules apply as for exam in week seven.

Again, the maximum number of points to be gained is 36, the actual score is denoted by r .

The tests for Dutch programs will be in Dutch as well as in English. The tests for English programs will only be in English.

The final grade is determined by the following formula (with an accuracy of one decimal):

- Regular exam week 7: $t_1 = \frac{p+4}{4}$.
- Resit week 10: $t_2 = \frac{r+4}{4}$.
- The final grade for Calculus 1B equals: $\max \{t_1, t_2\}$.
- All scores, with an accuracy of one decimal, will be transferred to the students educational program.

There will be a case study. This is an assignment in which the subject matter is applied to a specific problem typical to the students program of study. The case study illustrates the use of mathematics in the daily practice of professionals in his subject area. The following rules apply:

- The result of the case assignment is either a pass or a fail,
- For a pass of Calculus 1B the case study should be completed with a pass,
- A fail for the case study may be repaired through an extended assignment, provided that the final grade is at least equal to 5.
